2.1	Medical Detox Project	Pointers from the Central Document: Community / Home Detox which requires monitoring by community detox nurse and liaising with GP and home support Residential setting with 24 hour supervision with support worker with preference of withdrawal management training Hospital care in the medical ward Focus of this document is based on alcohol issues Discussion Social Detox – no medication Community Detox – medical support from a GP or nurse practitioner The staffing and level of expertise is limited on the medical wards to deal with medical detox Access issues with some districts entering medical beds in hospitals and not all districts have access to detox nurses which is difficult for rural areas There are no services available within Midland for medical detox in favour of children who are transferred to Odyssey in Auckland Outreach social detox in rural areas such as Tairawhiti coastal youth - therapeutic and hands on Questions we need to ask: How many beds are we funded for in our region in terms of medical detox? What is the level of competence available in our region to adequately support medical detox? Is there awareness in the Midland region about the services available? Feedback based on following questions: What can be accessed now? What are the future gaps? What questions do you have for the consultant?
