# Māori Health Coexisting Disorders

- Qualification: Diploma in Applied Māori Health Coexisting Disorders Level 6
- Entry Criteria: Currently employed and or working with Māori  
Achieved a Level 4 or 5 qualification in Social Services  
or experience in Māori Health  
Police Vetting
- Pre-Requisites: Access to computer & internet  
Supervision  
Support from Agency
- Course Length: 12 months
- Location: Rotorua \*accomodation available at venue
- Fee: applies \*Te Rau Matatini workforce scholarships available

# Māori Health Coexisting Disorders

## Course Structure:

- 11 Monthly wānanga and 240 hours of practicum including 11 monthly online tutorials.
- Students will undertake two placements, of which 40 hours must be completed on the side of the person's normal place of employment.

## Clinical Supervision:

- Are required to have formal a formal supervision arrangement.

## Practitioner Competencies

- Each student will be required to meet the Practitioner Competencies for Alcohol & Drug Workers in Aotearoa New Zealand 2001.
